In parallel, a special program was organized for teachers and principals, where experts delivered seminars on the latest advancements in AI tools for educators and National Education Policy.

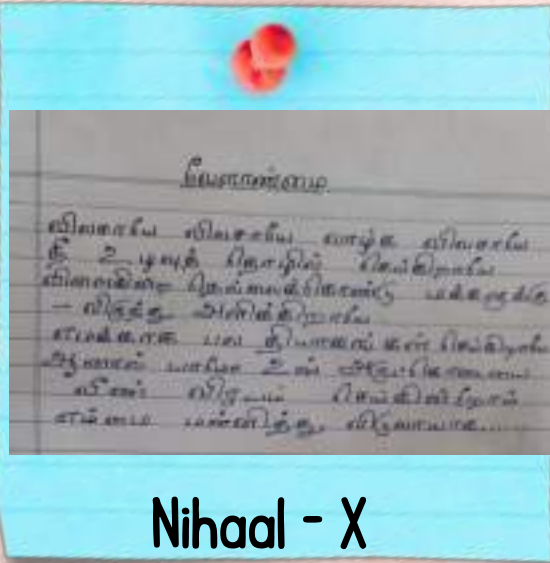

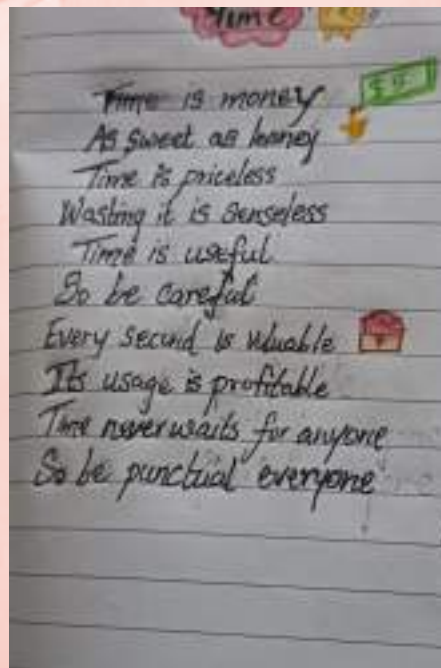
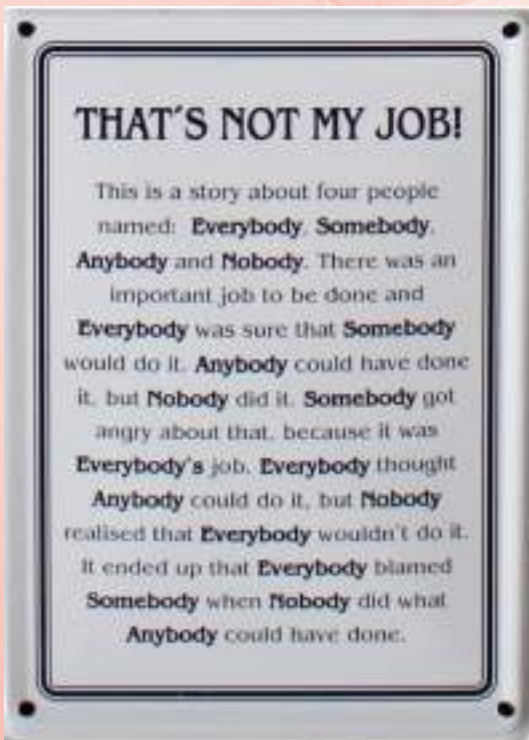

Students must read this book!!!

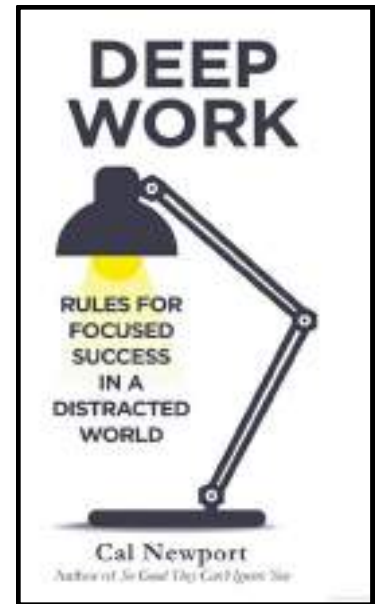
If your mind bounces around all day. You must read this book. So this book says how to go deep in our works in this distracted world

What is deep work? Deep work is the ability to focus without distractions on a cognitively demanding task.

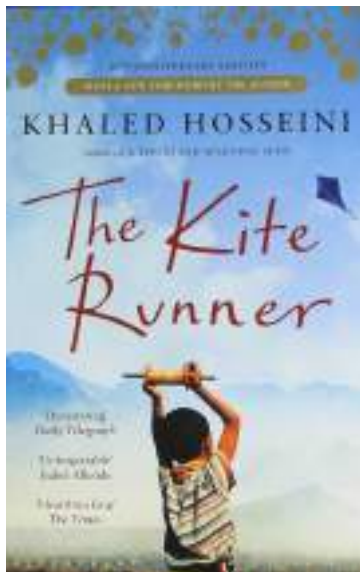
It protects us from getting getting distracted by your phone notifications, social media or multiple browser tabs. It's about training the brain to embrace ONE thing at a time
